## Protect Florida's Communities

A new Florida law would give the Governor sweeping powers to shut down nonprofit organizations that advocate for social justice and criminalize the volunteers and donors who support them, simply because he disagrees with their mission.

This is an attack on free speech. But more than that, it threatens the lifelines our communities depend on: food banks, domestic violence shelters, organizations serving children, seniors, and Floridians navigating our complex immigration system. No family should lose access to food, safety, or support because a politician disagrees with the people helping them.

This bill would mandate that state-issued IDs visibly reflect whether a person is a U.S. citizen or not. The use of citizenship labels creates a ranking system that invites unequal treatment, weaponizes state identification documents, and could expose noncitizens, including lawful permanent residents, visa holders, refugees, asylees, and others with lawful status, to discrimination, profiling, and unnecessary privacy intrusions.

State-issued IDs are meant to verify identity and driving privileges — not to serve as a tool for public classification or immigration enforcement!

## **UN Convention on the Protection of the Rights of All Migrant Workers and Members of their Families**

The **International Convention on the Protection of the Rights of All Migrant Workers and Members of Their Families (ICRMW)** was adopted by the UN General Assembly on 18 December 1990 and entered into force on 1 July 2003. It is the most comprehensive international treaty addressing the rights of migrant workers, covering all stages of migration: preparation, transit, employment, and return. The Convention applies to all migrant workers and their families, regardless of nationality, sex, race, religion, or legal status.

### **Key Rights and Protections**

The Convention guarantees a wide range of rights for migrant workers:

- **Freedom of movement and return:** Migrants can leave and return to their country of origin and maintain cultural and family ties.
- **Protection from abuse:** Migrants must not be subjected to torture, cruel, inhuman, or degrading treatment, and detained migrants must be treated with dignity.
- **Equal treatment:** Migrants in regular situations are entitled to working and living conditions no less favorable than nationals, including safety, health, and social protections.
- **Access to services:** Migrants have rights to emergency medical care, education, social services, and legal assistance.
- **Labor rights:** Migrants can join trade unions, receive fair wages, and have access to legal remedies for employment disputes.
- **Protection against collective expulsion:** Expulsion decisions must be individual, communicated in a language understood by the migrant, and allow for review and compensation.

## Refugees and Asylum Seekers

The United Nations emphasizes the following principles:

- Ensure the right to seek asylum and enjoy safe refuge from persecution.
- Protect refugees from forced return to their home countries.
- Guarantee access to basic needs, including food, shelter, and healthcare.
- Promote the right to work and education for refugees in host countries.
- Facilitate family reunification to support the social stability of refugees.
- Encourage international cooperation to share the responsibility of hosting refugees.
